

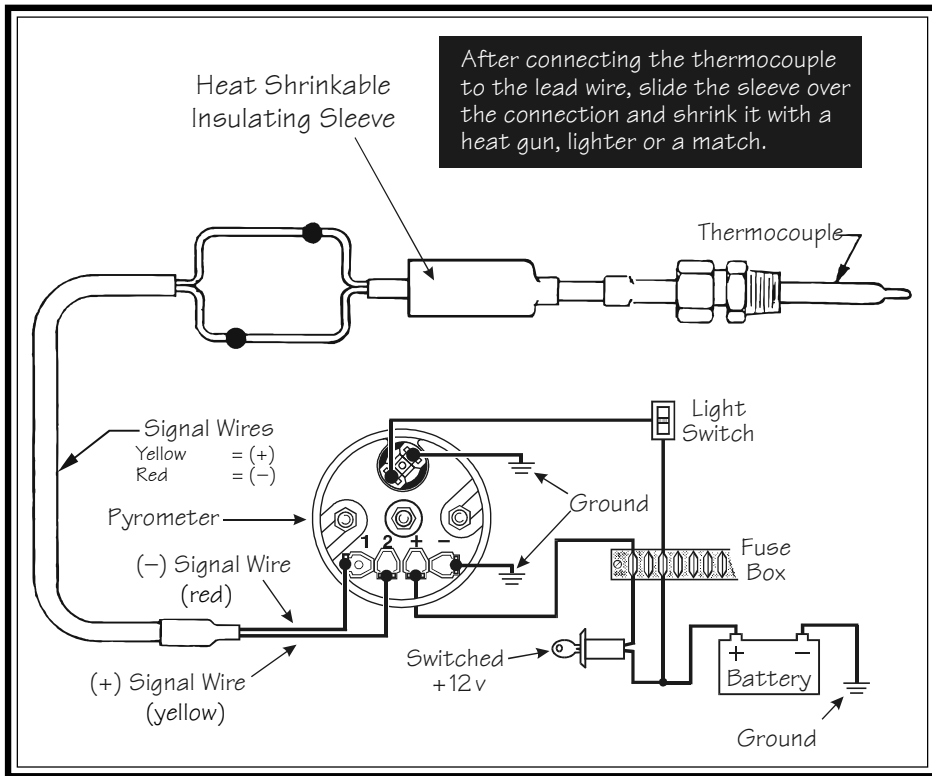

Proper wiring of the VDO Pyrometer

Pyrometer Installation:

1. Run wires from the Pyrometer location through the firewall to:
2. Select the location where you will mount the gauge, and mark a center point.
3. Cut a 2 1/16" (52 mm) diameter hole. If the gauge is too snug, use a file to slightly

Tools and Materials Needed For Installation:

16 Gauge stranded, insulated wire
Non-insulated 1/4" spade connectors
2 1/16" hole saw
Drill and drill bit set
Half-round file
Tape measure or ruler
Small tools: wrench or nut driver, utility knife, pliers, etc.
Various engine adapters

enlarge the opening.

4. Slip the VDO Spin-Lok™ Mounting Clamp over the back of the instrument. It's direction depends on the thickness of the panel (Diagram B). Tighten the clamp until the Pyrometer can no longer be rotated by hand.

DO NOT OVERTIGHTEN.

Wiring the Pyrometer:

1. Run wires from the Pyrometer location through the firewall to:
- a) the positive (+) terminal on the battery (both after the fuse box and after the ignition or other switch).

CAUTION!!!

The bezel diameter is only a few millimeters larger than the gauge itself. **With that in mind, measure and precisely mark the gauge location before cutting any holes!**

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE INSTALLATION OF THE PYROMETER ARE CONTAINED HEREIN. USE IS RESTRICTED TO 12-VOLT NEGATIVE GROUND ELECTRICAL SYSTEMS. LIGHT BULB, IF SUPPLIED, IS 12 VOLT.

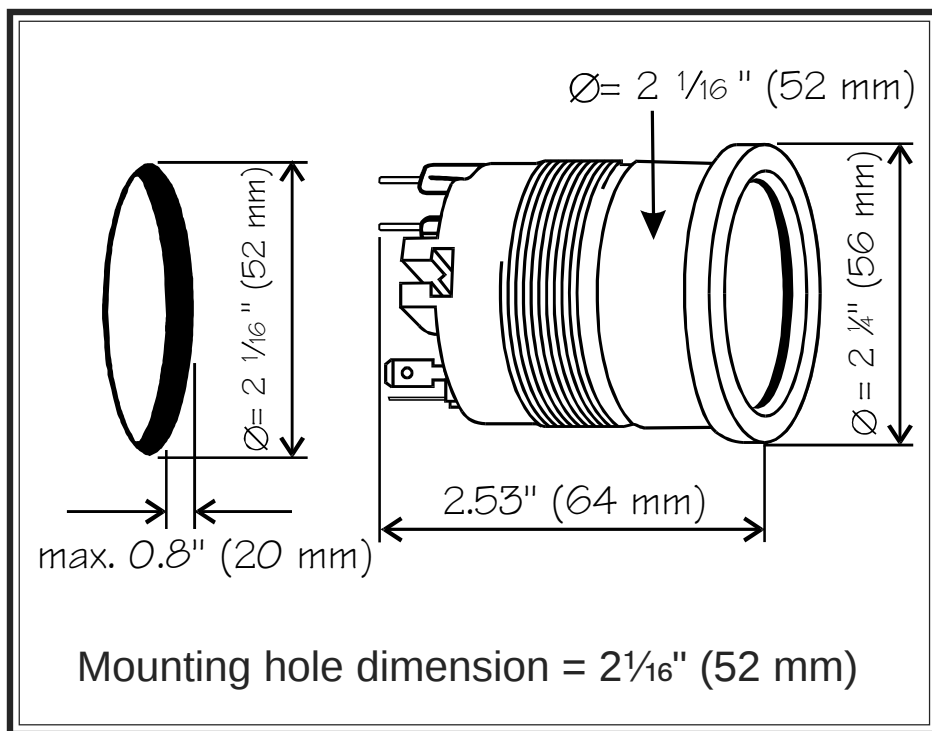

- b) the light switch (also after the fuse in the fuse box);
 - c) a good ground location (i.e., where the negative (-) battery pole is connected to the chassis of the vehicle); and
 - d) the thermocouple, which provides the signal for your pyrometer.
2. Connect the positive (+), negative [ground] (-), and the positive and negative

signal wires from the thermocouple as shown in Diagram C. Note the color-coding of the thermocouple wires.

3. Connect the appropriate positive (+) and ground (negative [-]) wires to the pyrometer lamp socket as shown in Diagram C.

At this point, the installation and wiring of your new VDO Pyrometer is complete. Turn on the ignition and the lights in the car and check to see that the instrument and light are working properly. If they aren't, re-check your wiring, referring to the wiring description in Diagram C.

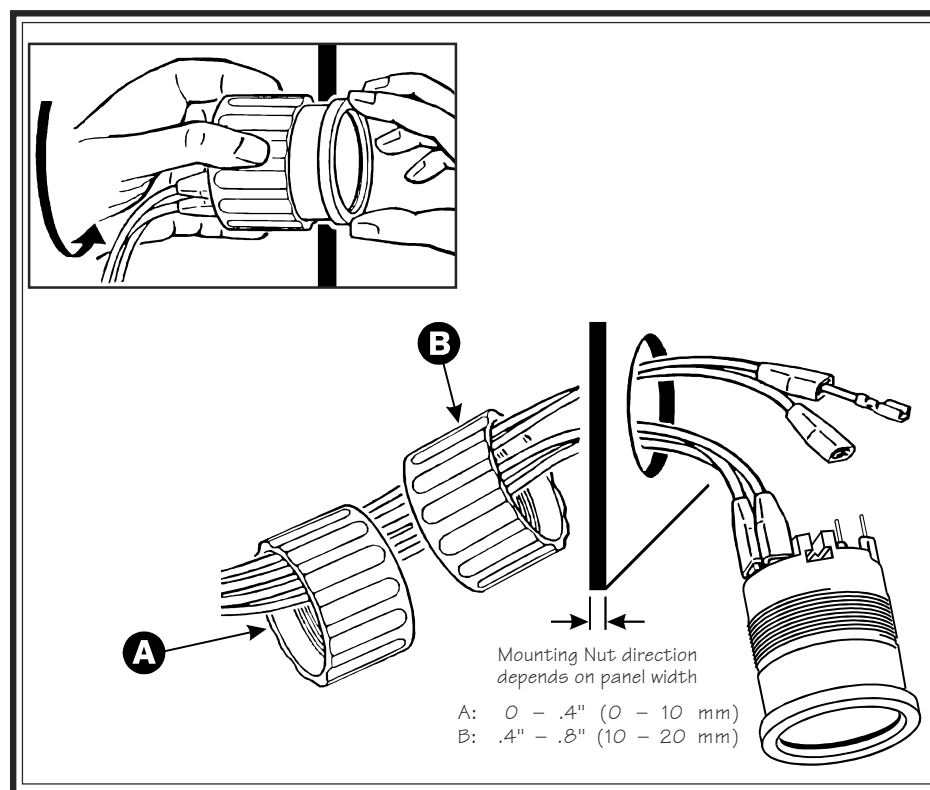
